## The PREP Program of the SF Public Utilities Commission

Program replaces old fixtures (primarily toilets that use at least 3.5 gallons per flush. Fixtures installed after 1994 do not qualify) with water-efficient models for residential account holders, free of charge. PREP is open for single-family and multi-family account holders. All the details can be found on webpage. Applicants can apply online. Participants are required to have water efficient showerheads, faucets and/or faucet aerators which our inspectors provide for free.
